SMREET: DISSENSION WITHIN THE PATRIARCHATE.

Chronic dissensions within the Patriarchate have recently come to the surface as the result of various steps taken by Athenegores to get rid of the opposition against him. This her taken the form of a shifting of archbishops and nominations of 300 new Metropolitans, which has caused dissension within the Saint Synod and elsewhere. The nomination of Mgr. Jakovos, the Metropolitan of Imros, to be Metropolitan of Derkos has been particulerly opposed, although it is known he is being personally pushed by the Patrierch. Actually, it is now rumored that Mgr. Jakovos may soon replace Mgr. Meliton as Grand Vicar.

Perhans the most serious breech has been the result of Athenacoras' attempt to remove the Director of the Theological Seminary at Heybeliada by assigning him to be Metropolitan of Leros and Kaliminos (Dodecanese). The Director, Mgr. Chrysostomas, is well known to have been opposed to Athenagores ever since his errival in Istanbul and has held meetings at the Seminary attended O by a number of the younger Archbishops (Leodycea, Pergemum and Chaldea), at which the policies and general attitude of the Patriarch have been severely criticized. It is known also that a Turkish Professor of the Theological Seminary, Mubeyit Bey, has also been present and has enlisted the sympathy of the Istanbul Director of Education in the controversy. Mer. Chrysostamos has now refused to comply with the decision of Athenagoras to remove him and has openly revolted against the decision, threatening to take it before the Saint Synod. The proposed successors to Mgr. Chrysostamos ere Mgr. Koukouzi, a protegee of the Metropolitan of Derkos, and Mgr. Jakovos, both of whom are not acceptable to other Metropolitans.
Most of the Orthodox community, however, is critical of Mgr.
Chrysostamos, who has held his job for almost two decades, for refusing to acknowledge the Patriarch's order. Athenagoras has indicated that if the Istanbul Director of Education intervenes, he will take the matter up with the Minister of Education in Ankart. Jakovos, both of whom are not acceptable to other Metropolitans.

During the recent visit of President Celal Basar U to Istanbul, a reception was arranged at the Vali's office. The local press reported that warm cordiality was expressed on all sides and news pictures showed the Patriarch linked arm in arm

with the President.

Although the Orthodox community now understands the necessity of the Patrierch's intention to cooperate fully with the Government, particularly since the departure of the People's Party from power, and supports him in his controversy with Mgr. Chrysostamus, there still exists opposition to many of the Patriarch's reforms which appear contrary to established tradition.
